Medical certificate

The 22-years-old mentally disabled woman, Mariami Arevadze, has been treated several times in our mental institution, at last to May 4th 2020 due to impulsive and aggressive behaviour with uncertain predictability. Alternately there are no intense behavioral problems observable over long periods of time. Coexisting psychotic symptoms have to be considered.

Therefore a flight of the patient back to Georgia should be planned in attendance of a psychiatrically experienced physician who can take appropriate action by psychopharmacologic medication in particular for temporarily sedation or finalize anxious and aggressive reactions if necessary.
